COMPOSITION

Each tablet contains Ibuprofen BP 200 mg

PHARMACOLOGY

Ibuprofen is a propionie acid derivative, having analgesic, antipyrectic and anti-inflammatory activity. The drug's therapeutic effects as a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory are thought to inhibit prostaglandin synthetase and therefore the synthesis of prostaglandin which are known to be involved in the sensitization of pain receptors and the inflammatory process.

INDICATIONS As an analgesic and anti-inflammatory in the treatment of rheumatoid arthritis (including juvenile rheumatoid arthritis or Still's Disease), ankylosing spondylitis, osteoarthritis and non-rheumatoid (scronegative) orthopathies. In the treatment of non-articular rheumatic conditions, including frozen shoulder (capsulitis), bursitis, tendonitis, tenosynovitis, low back pain and soft tissue injuries such as sprains and strains. As an analgesic in the relief of mild to moderate pain such as dysmenorrhea; dental and post-operative pain and for the

symptomatic relief of headache including migraine. DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION

Adults: The recommended dosage is 1200-1800mg in 3-4 divided doses preferably after food some patients can be maintained on 600 1200 mg daily. In severe or acute conditions the dose can be increased until the cute phase is brought under control; the total daily dosage should not exceed 2400mg in divided doses.

Children: Daily dosage is 20mg/kg of body weight in divided doses. This can be achieved as follows:

- 1 2 years: 50mg three to four times a day.
- 3 7 years: 100mg three to four times a day
- 8 12 years: 200mg three to four times a day

SIDE EFFECTS

The most commonly observed adverse effects are gastrointestinal disturbances such as nausea. vomiting, diarrhoca, dyspepsia, abdominal pain, melaena, hematemesis, ulcerative stomatitis. and gastrointestinal hemorrhage. Less frequently, thrombocytopenia has occurred. Other side effects associated with NSAIDs include fluid retention, headache, dizziness and vertigo PRECAUTIONS

Ibuprofen should be given with care to patients with a history of cardiac failure or hypertension since oedema has been reported in association with ibuprofen administration.

CONTRAINDICATIONS

Ibuprofen should not be given to patients with a history of an active, peptic ulceration. It is contraindicated in patients who have previously shown hypersensitivity reactions (asthma, rhinitis and urticaria) in response to ibuprofen, aspirin or other NSAIDs.
