**ZINC OXIDE OINTMENT USP 20% W/W**

Read all of this leaflet carefully before using this medicine

- Keep this leaflet. You may need to read it again.
- If you have any further questions, ask your health care provider or pharmacist.
- This medicine has been prescribed for you. Do not pass it on to others. It may harm them, even if their symptom are the same as yours.
- If you get any side effect, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effect not listed in this leaflet.

**1. What Zinc Oxide Ointment are and what they are used for?**  
Zinc oxide is an inorganic compound. Zinc oxide has mild antimicrobial as well as non-pore clogging properties. It creates a protective barrier and deflects UV rays off your skin (both UVA and UVB). Zinc oxide ointment are used:

- To treat diaper rash, anal itching, minor burns or other minor skin irritations.
- Providing broad-spectrum sun protection that prevents burns.
- Improving wound healing and preventing bacterial infections.

**2. What you need to know before you use Zinc Oxide Ointment?**  
Do not use this medicine if,

- You are allergic (hypersensitive) to Zinc oxide.
- You are allergic to dimethicones, lanolin, cod liver oil, petroleum jelly, parabens, mineral oil or wax.

**Take special care with Zinc Oxide Ointment**  
If you have

- Deep skin wounds.
- Severe burns.
- Systemic Zinc Toxicity.

**Taking with other medicines**  
Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking, have recently taken or might take any other medicines, including medicines obtained without prescription.

Tell your doctor if you are taking any of these following medicines:

- Ritonavir (used to treat HIV/AIDS)
- Quinolone (used as antibiotic)
- Cephalexin (used to treat infections caused by bacteria)
- Atazanavir (used to treat HIV/AIDS)
- Cisplatin (used to treat Cancer)

**Using Zinc Oxide Ointment with food and drink**  
Talk to your doctor or pharmacist for best advice on foods and drinks to avoid while using Zinc oxide ointment.

**Pregnancy and breast-feeding**  
Talk to your doctor or pharmacist before using this medicine if you are pregnant or breast-feeding, think you might be pregnant or are planning to have a baby.

**Driving and using machine**  
Zinc oxide do not affect the ability to drive or operate machinery.

**3. How to use Zinc Oxide Ointment?**

- Always use this medicine exactly as your doctor or health care provider has told you. You should check with your doctor or health care provider if you are not sure.
- Do not take by mouth. It is used only on skin.
- Wash hands after use.
- Unless otherwise prescribed by the doctor, direction for use is:

**For prevention and treatment of diaper rash:**  
Apply a thin layer of Zinc oxide ointment to clean, dry skin after each diaper change. This helps protect the skin from irritation and moisture.

**For minor skin irritations:**  
Apply a thin layer of Zinc oxide ointment to the affected area as needed, usually 1-3 times daily, or as directed by a healthcare provider.

**If you use more Zinc Oxide Ointment than you should**  
If you have accidentally used more ointment than your doctor has told you to, contact your doctor; it may cause you to absorb more of the medication.

**If you forget to use Zinc Oxide Ointment**  
If you miss a dose of this medicine, apply it as soon as possible. However, if it is almost time for your next dose, skip the missed dose and go back to your regular dosing schedule.

**If you stop using Zinc Oxide Ointment**  
Do not stop using Zinc oxide ointment, even if you feel better. It is important to use the ointment as long as the doctor has told you to, otherwise your medicine might not work properly.  
If you have any further questions on the use of this product, ask your doctor or health care provider.

**4. Possible side effect:**  
Like all medicines, Zinc oxide can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.  
**More common side effect:** Rash, itching/swelling (especially of the face / tongue / throat)  
**Less common side effect:** Severe dizziness, trouble in breathing.  
If any of the side effects get serious, or if you notice any side effect not listed in this leaflet, please tell your doctor or health care provider.

**5. How to store Zinc Oxide Ointment?**  
Do not store above 30°C. Protect from light.  
Keep out of the reach and sight of children.  
Store in the original carton.  
Do not use this medicine after the expiry date stated on the carton (MM/YYYY)
